Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, no purchase necessary. Appointments recommended.

Elaine Johns, President, called the meeting to order. Minutes from the previous meeting were read. Motion made by Steve Stephens and seconded by Linda Barton to adopt the minutes as read.

Chuck presented the February Treasurer's report. As of meeting date, balance was \$26,075.67.

Margaret Taylor presented our program. She had received an email from Debra Walker, requesting that Steel Magnolias write letter to Cong. Mike Rogers and Sen. Richard Shelby regarding S497 bill pertaining to the fact that insurance companies had refused to pay for compress garments used for the treatment of Lymphedema. Each member present wrote a letter to either Cong. Rogers and/or Sen. Shelby urging them to vote for this bill. Ms. Walker was going to hand carry these letters to Washington on Saturday.

A discussion was held on the Annual Bake and Jewelry Sale to be held Saturday, March 31, 2018, from 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM, at the Quintard Mall. Marti Warren told us that most of the jewelry had been repaired and/or cleaned, and except for some tagging, was ready for sale. Elaine encouraged each member to try to bake something to sell and to come shop for Easter and Mothers' Day.

Jimmy Taylor talked about the golf tournament scheduled for April 22, 2018, at Pine Hill Country Club. Registration is \$65.00 through the 14th of April; then registration will be \$75.00. However, you can register as late as the morning of the tournament. We would like to have as many as 36 teams. As of meeting time, we had 30 sponsors, need 75 to make a successful tournament. Registration forms, information pamphlets, and advisement forms were handed out to each member present. Jimmy emphasized the importance of this golf tournament as it is the largest fund raiser that Steel Magnolias does for the year.

Sherry relayed to us the opportunity she and her husband had to attend the President's Prayer Breakfast and what an awesome event it was. This opportunity was provided by Cong. Mike Rogers. 
