Finding Freedom

In reading a survivors story in curetoday.com, I wanted to share some of her story.

This lady is a 65-year-old who just celebrated 9 years survivorship. She talks about the day when she discovered the lump and how it made her feel. She was going about her normal daily routine and suddenly, everything changed. She was overcome with fear. She went through all the motions of visiting different doctors, having test, and then surgery.

She did not know what the future would hold for her. There was no instruction manual, she watched YouTube videos and read blogs. She found everyone's story was different in many ways, but much the same in others. Her life at first was a struggle. She did not feel good, her energy was zapped. She did not realize it at the time, but all the things were normal for someone who had just experienced a major trauma like breast cancer.

Her body began to heal and she tried to stay active as much as possible. When she tired, she slowed down or stopped. She learned to process her emotions and gave herself permission to feel. She learned it was ok to cry, to laugh, to scream or to be angry.

It's been 9 years now and she said she doesn't think about cancer as much. There are annual reminders and her scars have faded some, but she can still see them. Her arms still swell, especially in the summer from the lymphedema. She says all in all when she reflects on her journey, she says she is blessed. Cancer is a great teacher. She has learned more valuable life lessons in the past 9 years than she had in her 65 years of life. She says that being the case, she can honestly say she is thankful. She is thankful she was deemed strong enough to handle the trial of breast cancer. She is thankful she weathered this extremely unexpected, very difficult storm with dignity and grace.

Right now, she is cancer free. She hopes to continue to be able to say that for many more years to come. She said she is a realist. Cancer could come back again. If something like that happens to her, she imagines she will be angry at first, but she will accept it and do the best she can. That's all any of us can do when cancer finds us.

So yes she has found her own form of freedom.

Be kind....


