SAIL Medicaid Waiver – providing services in the individual's home, reducing institutional placements.

Before I met Marti for the first time, I had heard of her. Actually, I read an article in the newspaper about this lady who had caused quite a scene at the Olive Garden Restaurant in Oxford. Marti, along with members of the Golden K (Oxford Kiwanis for Senior members) had gone to lunch at Olive Garden and was told she could not have the American Flag on display. Of course, this didn't set too well with Marti so she proceeded to "do her thang"! After contacting all the Olive Garden managers (local, region and district) and the media, Marti received an apology from the restaurant manager; as well as, an invitation to have her group return for lunch and to bring the American Flag to be put on display! I was in awe of this lady and her spunk without having ever met her!!

Fast forward a few months - Steve and I were at the Oxford Fest in October 2011. We were working in our Marine Corps League tent which was set up in front of Cotton's Antiques. Needing the use of their facilities and a break from the heat, we decided to go into Cotton's. We were immediately greeted by Marti. If you knew Marti, you know how friendly and outgoing she was; therefore, it shouldn't come as a surprise that we became fast friends. Of course, upon meeting Marti I brought up the Olive Garden story which led Marti to invite us to join the Golden K. We explained that we were currently very busy volunteering with other organizations and that our big project right then was Toys for Tots. When Marti learned that Steve was a Marine all bets were off!! You see, Marti "loved" all men in uniform especially a Marine!! With that same determination she had used to get the Olive Garden to change their flag policy, Marti set her sights on us and the rest is history. We agreed that after we finished with Toys for Tots that we would come visit the Golden K to decide if we were interested in joining. In March 2012, we both became Golden K members and got to know Marti even better. It was at that time when we met Chuck and Barbara Trull. Chuck was the treasurer of the Golden K and Marti was the President. It didn't take long for Marti to get us totally involved with the Golden K and Steve accepted the office of Vice-President.

Through the years, we worked on many projects with Marti, i.e. Special Olympics, East Central Alabama Cerebral Palsy Telethon, Steel Magnolias bake sale, Pinks Boutique, Jewelry Sales at RMC, Adopt a Military Family for Christmas, Toys for Tots – just too many to remember them all. Marti’s invitation to us to come buy goodies for Easter at the Steel Magnolias bake sale was how we ended up becoming volunteers with Steel Magnolias.

I was always amazed at the number of people that Marti knew. I never saw her go anywhere without running into someone that she knew and if she didn’t already know them, she became fast friends with them. She was never afraid to voice her opinion and you always knew where you stood with Marti.

I feel fortunate to have met Marti that day in October 2011 and to have become her friend. Steve and I will certainly miss her.

Marti has been my very close friend and confident for over 21 years. I first met Marti when we had a recycled jewelry sale booth in the Hudson's building and I worked for EAI Corporation in the same building. I began buying Marti's repaired and recycled jewelry for Barbara and my granddaughters and we became good friends and met and talked often at her booth during lunch. Our conversations often covered our childhood experiences and lives on the farm and before and during the World War II years. It was probably the similarity in our backgrounds that permitted the closeness and confidentiality that stayed with us over the years.

Marti and I became members of the Oxford Golden K Kiwanis Organization where we served from 2003 until 2012. Marti and I served as Secretary, President, Treasurer or Vice-President over the years until the organization disbanded due to the age and physical well-being of members and the reluctance of younger citizens to become involved. Marti invited me to join the Steel Magnolias at about the same time and suggested that I would learn a lot of what Barbara was going through since she was having breast cancer surgery and reconstruction which was one of our early conversations. It took several years for Barbara to come with me to the meetings but during the interim months and years Marti and I felt at ease to relate confidences back and forth making each of us even more open. Our closeness began to dissolve as "Pokey" became more infirmed and passed away. Marti was relegated to Nursing Facilities where her health became a concern. Our conversations became fewer and shortened until she was brought home and succumbed October 28, 2021.

I did not attend her church service or funeral because I was with Barbara 24/7 for some time before and Marti and I had requested each other to not attend and remember the mutual closeness of the last few years - -- I remember her fondly every day. I miss Marti and she is never absent from my thoughts. I like to think that we are still communicating with no long-distance charges.
