## STEEL MAGNOLIAS/MEN OF STEEL MEETING MINUTES APRIL 23, 2024

Meeting was called to order by our President, Elaine Johns. We had 29 in attendance which included 5 visitors.

The minutes from the previous meeting were presented and motion made by Steve and seconded by Susan that they be accepted as read.

Chuck gave the Treasurer's Report for April with a beginning balance of \$21,054.96 and ending balance of \$17,216.00.

Our guest speaker was Matt StJohn of StJohn's Nutrition in Oxford. He talked to us about adding herbs, vitamins, and minerals to our diet. He also talked to us about adjusting our diet to include eating an organic, non-gmo diet; drinking filtered water; avoiding white table sugar and white flour; avoiding soy; and avoiding an ingredient list that we do not understand. He also talked to us about removing chemicals from our lives by eliminating chemical deodorant and laundry detergent; not using harsh household chemicals; not using Roundup or synthetic weed killers or pesticides; not using artificial fragrances or scented candles. He then pointed out a bunch of places here in Calhoun County that either produce or dump toxic chemicals everyday in our water or in the air we breathe. He encouraged us to make an appointment at his store and let them come up with a plan of treatment for some of our problems.

Margaret and Jimmy gave an update on the golf tournament. As of meeting night we had 156 sponsors; 15 teams; and collected \$30,810.00. Margaret went over assignments for the volunteers for the tournament.

Door prizes were won by Donna, Jimmy, Gloria, Linda, and Nancy Buchman.

No further business, motion made by Steve and seconded by Eddie that meeting be adjourned.




