From Where I Sit

I was one of the original small group (as I remember there were five of us) that sat in Chaplain Wilson's small waiting room to talk about starting a support group for Breast Cancer Survivors. Lenora Johnson was hell bent on getting this group going. After a couple of meetings I decided not to stay with the group.

In a few days I got a call from Chaplain Wilson saying, "Marti, you have to come back. You are needed!" So I back I went.

Now that I am retired and primarily confined to home, I started thinking about how far Steel Magnolias have come. Here are some of our services to the community that we never dreamed would happen.

- 1. The Pinks Boutique. We furnish mastectomy bras, prosthesis, caps, wigs, scarves and hats to under or uninsured survivors for free.
- 2. Care Packages. They are given to the patient on her day of surgery or mailed to out of town patients. They contain may items to aid in her recovery.
- 3. Dining Vouchers. They are given to family members while their loved one is in surgery to use in RMC's cafeteria. They are free to two family members.
- 4. Breast Cancer Awareness Program. We have ladies that work with school nurses that talk to girls from 7th to 12th grades about this disease. They learn what to look for and how to do self exams.
- 5. Snacks. We maintain water coolers and baskets of snacks in the chemotherapy suites for the cancer patients at RMC and Anniston Oncology.
- 6. Transportation. We offer help for those who have no way home from chemotherapy treatments.

We also have a monthly newsletter that we send out by mail to about 500 people and send many more through email.

We have monthly dinner meetings in the private dining room at RMC.

The Steel Magnolias Breast Cancer Support Group Inc. met on Tuesday, May 26th in the private dining room of RMC.

President Elaine Johns welcomed our guests to the meeting.

Chaplain Sherry Grinstead gave the blessing before our meal of meat loaf and mashed potatoes provided by RMC. Side dishes and desserts were provided by Steel Magnolias members.

We did not have a guest speaker at this meeting.

BUSINESS MEETING:

Minutes from the April 28, 2015 meeting were read by Secretary Connie Stephens. Carrlotta Davis made a motion to accept the minutes as read and Judy Elder 2nd the motion. The minutes were accepted as read.

Sherry talked about Memorial Day and asked members to share some of their memories. After hearing many of the members discuss some of their memories, Sherry discussed that we should always try to make good rather than bad memories. After the devotional, Sherry ended with a prayer.

Steve Stephens made the motion to adjourn the meeting and Carrlotta Davis 2nd the motion. Meeting was adjourned.
