

Steel Magnolias & Men of Steel Meeting September 27, 2016

The Steel Magnolias Breast Cancer Support Group Inc. met on Tuesday, September 27th in the private dining room of RMC.

The meeting was called to order by President Elaine Johns. We had several visitors who were introduced and welcomed by Elaine.

Sherry Grinstead gave the blessing before our meal of chicken fingers provided by RMC. Side dishes and desserts were provided by Steel Magnolias members.

Elaine introduced our speaker Wendy Watson, RN, BSN, OCN. Wendy is the Director of Cancer Support Services at RMC. Wendy spoke about the new Patient Navigation Program at RMC that helps patients through their cancer journey by providing whatever the patient may need, i.e. answering questions, arranging transportation to doctors appointments, and providing resources as needed. This is an Oncology Care Model that is funded by a Medicare grant. To be accepted in the program patients must be a Medicare Patient, have a cancer diagnosis and receiving chemotherapy treatment or taking an oral therapy. The program currently has 130 patients enrolled. Three of the members of the navigator team, Macy Allen, Pam Bolt and Celeste McGuffey also provide our group with valuable information about the program.

BUSINESS MEETING:

Secretary Connie Stephens read the minutes from the August meeting. Marilyn Lawson made the motion to accept the minutes as read and Steve Stephens 2^{nd} the motion. The minute meetings were accepted.
